DSO invites you to an evening of deep listening and dazzling imagination, where music grows from a simple idea into something far greater. The season opens with the world premiere of *Ground* by Netanela Mizrahi, celebrating her third year as our Composer in Residence.

Experience the transformative power of imagination as Shostakovich, Franck, Rachmaninov, and Hindemith reveal how simple themes can blossom into works of lasting vitality. Each piece showcases the composers' extraordinary creativity and the expressive possibilities of the orchestra.

Audiences will be swept away by pianist Stefan Cassomenos in Rachmaninov's beloved Paganini Variations and Franck's Symphonic Variations. Alongside the tension, wit, and colour of Shostakovich and Hindemith, the program showcases every section of the orchestra, culminating in music that is joyful, powerful, and life-affirming.

This is a concert about connections: to ideas, to each other, and to the shared ground where imagination takes flight.

Islands capture our imagination as places where the sea meets the land, where cultures exchange signals across distance, and where solitude sparks creativity. This concert gathers music shaped by those powerful images.

To open the concert, guest conductor Fabian Russell conducts Mills' composition *Island Signal/Island Song*, featuring four horn soloists from within the DSO. Inspired by the Torres Strait conch shell call and the echoes of Venetian canals, the work celebrates connection across distance and time. Rautavaara then offers a vision of a mythical isle of bliss, radiant with colour and harmony. Mendelssohn brings us the sweeping drama of the Hebrides, where wild seas crash against rugged cliffs. Finally, Tchaikovsky, writing from the waterside in Venice, turns the island setting into an inner journey with his Fourth Symphony, a profound meditation on fate and resilience.

Together, these works invite us to consider islands not as places apart, but as spaces of encounter, beauty, and inspiration.

Due to popular demand, we are offering limited tickets to DSO's exclusive VIP area.



Shakespeare's works have inspired some of the world's most magnificent music, and this program celebrates that legacy with drama, beauty, and emotional depth. This coproduction with Darwin theatre company, Brown's Mart, brings together the richness of orchestral sound and the raw energy of live theatre – revealing why the Bard's stories continue to move audiences across centuries.

Berlioz and Tchaikovsky explore the tragic romance of Romeo and Juliet, while the mischievous magic of Mendelssohn illuminates A Midsummer Night's Dream. The program culminates with Darwin vocal ensemble Vocalective joining the orchestra for Vaughan Williams' radiant Serenade to Music, which borrows lyrics from The Merchant of Venice.

Shakespeare's words will be vividly brought to life by one of the Northern Territory's most celebrated actors, Rob Collins, weaving spoken performance through this program of masterworks, directed by Yvette Walker and Shari Sebbens.

EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

A YEAR OF EXCITING AND INTERACTIVE MUSICAL EXPERIENCES ACROSS THE NT

2026 is another packed year of community and education performances, collaborations and workshops across the Territory.

In April we take our acclaimed Choose Your
Own Adventure education program on the road
touring to Barkly and Central Australia. Poet and
storyteller Melanie Mununggurr and composer
Simon Bruckard team up to bring this rollicking
adventure to life, performed by a daring
ensemble of DSO musicians.

In October, explore the connection between music, sport and well-being in Score! We're swapping out our concert shoes for sneakers and hitting the gym as we invite young people to participate in an interactive exploration of music, movement and meditation.

Also in October, the full orchestra returns to Palmerston, with Palmerston Classics and Palmerston Family Proms. Join us for two days of beautiful music and fun for the family.

Our year-round Young Artists Program continues, offering exciting musical experiences and orchestral training for young musicians. In 2026 we are expanding this opportunity to include students from year 5 to year 12 and are creating a mentor trainee program for our senior YAP students.

Through our music workshops and community initiatives DSO continues to grow our connections with schools and communities across the territory. 2026 sees us collaborate and deliver music workshops to schools and communities in Darwin, Palmerston, Katherine, as well as the Vic Daly, Barkly and Central Australia Regions.

FOSTERING THE NEXT GENERATION OF TALENTED TERRITORY MUSICIANS

Our Young Artists Program enables aspiring musicians to hone their skills, meet like-minded and dedicated young people, and experience the thrill of sharing a stage with a symphony orchestra.

Led by DSO's Education & Outreach Coordinator and Principal Cellist, Stephanie Arnold, DSO Young Artists meet weekly throughout the school term for classes and rehearsals with professional music educators and orchestral members. Through the program participants have opportunities to play side-by-side with DSO, participate in a series of masterclasses with world-class visiting artists and take part in several special community performance opportunities through the year.

In 2026 the YAP program is expanding to include students from Year 5 to Year 12, who play an orchestral instrument and are dedicated to developing their musical skills.

2026 will also see the creation of a mentoring initiative for our senior YAP students. These students will mentor younger musicians while receiving tailored support to transition smoothly into community and professional orchestras. The program will help them grow as both leaders and musicians, building confidence, skills, and real-world experience.






